Update on Club Restoration Campaign

December 7, 2024

Dear Members and Friends -

The busy holiday season is upon us! And we are doubly busy at the club! We've consulted over 15 contractors and experts to assess damage and cost out repairs due to the impact of hurricanes Helene and Milton.

We continue to reach out for assistance in funding the restorations underway. Our goal is \$150,000. It is an ambitious goal, but will fund emergency repairs as well as capital improvements long needing attention. A big "thank you!" to those who have generously donated, bringing our total to \$55,165, a little more than a third of the way there. But we must be honest that the need continues to be great.

Projects include: Roof and guttering (contractor selected and replacement scheduled late December); inside **ceiling** water damage; two air conditioner motors out (replaced); exterior emergency doors; saltwater intrusion into portions of the **electrical system** (repaired); a non-functioning kitchen **cooler**; damage to **furniture** and cabinets; restoration of **terrazzo** flooring; creating a concrete water diversion barrier at the perimeter of the parking lot (complete).

We have sought out a contractor who specializes in restoration--not replacement--of historic floors like ours. He believes ours is a good candidate, being crafted from high quality maple. Some new wood will be required, but amazingly, we went into the club attic and--lo and behold--found two usable bundles of the **original maple** floor boards, extras from the original 1957 installation! So, we're hopeful that we'll be able to bring St. Pete's most beautiful dance floor back to life!
